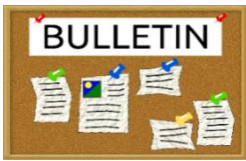

## International Projects

### REPORT FROM TURKEY - MAY 2023 by Beverly Parsons

On February 6, 2023, at 4:17 AM, a 7.8 magnitude earthquake rocked southeast Turkey and adjacent Syria. The confirmed death toll stands at 59,259 with countless injured and missing. The federation board of SI Türkiye did what Soroptimists do and started to work.

1. More than 2000 items of clothing were sent to the area immediately.
2. Zoom meetings were organized to communicate with the earthquake area, the Soroptimist European Union and Soroptimists clubs worldwide.
3. Immediate Financial support was provided to the Antakya club for urgent needs.
4. Ten pallets of water were sent to areas in crisis.
5. Scholarships were set up to support 60 students affected by the earthquake.
6. Shelter (in the form of 10 containers) was provided for women of the Women' Initiative Cooperative and bedding supplied.
7. A container was provided to house Hatay Yellow Silkworms which are in danger of extinction.
8. 300 hygiene packages were delivered along with personal letters.
9. Prostheses were fitted and physical therapy provided for 3 girls who lost their limbs.

10. Eighty sacks of cotton seeds were donated for immediate planting.
11. Desks and cabinets were provided to classroom containers in the public training center at Arsuz-Hatay.
12. Twenty washing machines were installed.

Many schools in the earthquake zone have been totally destroyed, a major concern as our central Soroptimist goal is to emphasize education for women and girls. To that end, immediate efforts are focused on the construction of a school allowing students to continue their education without endangering their future.

SI San Diego, along with SI Tijuana Centro, SI North San Diego County, our friends and families, sent approximately \$9,350.00 to the Turkish Soroptimist Federation in Istanbul. Two members of our Friendship Link, Etiler Soroptimist Istanbul, are on the SI Türkiye board as Vice President and Head of Finance. Four Etiler club members visit the earthquake area on a regular basis. They report that the situation is much worse than we see on cable news.

Many of you reading this report have contributed to this Soroptimist earthquake relief effort. Our friends in Türkiye send their DEEPEST APPRECIATION, both for the financial support and the knowledge that so many of us on this side of the world care.





## DUES ARE DUE!

Our 2023-2024 club year starts on July 1, so it is time to pay your SISD dues. Annual dues

are \$146.18 - \$140.00 dues and \$6.18 Founders Pennies.

**NOTE:** In late April, we received notice from SIA that dues for each member will increase by \$4.00 beginning 2023-2024 club year. When the Board meets in June, we will discuss an increase in our club dues. We have not had an increase in over 8 years. If an increase is approved, it will be due in August or September.

Dues are important for the administration of the club, our region and our federation. The club's portion of your dues is used for the administration of the club – P.O Box rent, sending our delegates to conferences and conventions, bonding insurance, speaker gifts, supplies, recruitment & retention efforts, leadership training, etc. If you are interested in the finances of the club, take a term as the club's treasurer or join the Budget & Finance Committee!

### **More about Founders Pennies...**

The tradition of Founders Pennies began in 1943 when clubs collected one penny for each year of Soroptimist's existence and used the money to help re-establish clubs in Europe that had disbanded as a result of pre-World War II political conditions and the war itself. In 1946 the fund was renamed the Founders Fund, and it provided international fellowships, scholarships and other awards to improve the status of women. Beginning in the 1960s, Founders Pennies provided funding for the Youth Citizenship Awards, and in 1972 for the Live Your Dream Awards (then called the Training Awards Program).

**How are Founders Pennies used now?** Founders Pennies are now used to fund the Live Your Dream Awards and other

SIA programs that improve the lives of women and girls in local communities and throughout the world. Founders

Pennies represent approximately 10 percent of the \$1.5 million of contributed income needed for programs.

**How are Founders Pennies calculated?** Founders Pennies are set at \$.06 per member times the number of years that SIA has been in existence... 1921. 6 cents x 103 YEARS! YAY for us!!
