ARE YOU A FENCE RIDER?


A fence rider sits with her legs dangling down each side of a fence and is torn between two options.

International Projects: What does the *International* in *SISD* Mean to You?

International is in every Soroptimist Clubs' name, so let's do a quick refresher on what this really means. Although the first Soroptimist Club was started in Alameda County, California one hundred years ago, the Founders from Day One saw Soroptimist as an International Organization, and they took immediate steps to accomplish this. Soroptimist International's headquarters is in Cambridge, England, one of Great Britain's two famous university cities. And all the international work of our organization originates and is directed from this site.

Kathy Biewenga of SISD's International Committee, bless her heart, did some international sleuthing, and she discovered that on January 29th the *Soroptimist International Advocacy Team* would hold the first session of a three-part series to focus on the *Purposes* and *Logistics* needed to participate in the *UN's 66th Session Commission on The Status of Woman*, to be held in New York at the United Nations on March 14 to 25th, 2022.

I listened in on this session and I can assure you of one thing: The International arm of Soroptimist is a really big deal. Session participants consisted of 45 members from every continent. Discussions focused on both GO (Governmental) and NGO (Non-Governmental) Organizations that focus on Proposals and Issues that fall under the *Status and Gender Empowerment of Women*. The content and nitty-gritty details of the issues being discussed was impossible to fully comprehend. But one point I did learn from an Australian participant was that changing references to 'Women' must be preceded by 'ALL'. This because using 'Women' alone delegates coverage that ends with the child-bearing years, leaving uncovered women beyond 49 years old.

The other thing I can report is the respect that Soroptimists have for and from United Nations Representatives. The group of attendees, as diverse as were their locations and backgrounds, were totally tuned in to both local and international issues. And those who had been through previous Commissions made it clear that the meetings would be intense and draining. I came away from this experience feeling rightly humbled by the intensity and competence of

our Organization's International leaders. We truly are the International Organization of our title.
